This is the last Will and Testament of me George
Eyre of Hazzlewood in the Parish of Duffield and
County of Derby made and declared this eighteenth
day of February in the year of our Lord one Thousand
seven hundred and ninety two - and first my Will
is that all my just debts and funeral expences be
fully paid & discharged & I then give and devise
to my loving wife Elizabeth Eyre all my real estate lying
and being in Hazzlewood to enjoy & receive the profits thereof
during the term of her natural life and after her decease
my Will is and I thereby give and devise to James Eyre
son of my Sister Hannah Harrison wife of Thomas Harrison
my house wherein I reside with the land and the whole
of the premises which I purchased of the said Thomas and
Hannah Harrison & likewise the allotments thereto
belonging charging him with the payment of twenty pounds
ten pence to my Nephew John Goodwin & ten pounds to
his Brother William Goodwin in twelve months after her
decease I likewise give to my two Nephews John and
William Goodwin a piece of land lying in the Liberty of
Hazzlewood and likewise the allotment thereto belonging
after my wife's decease to be equally divided between them
share and share alike known by the name of little
Bradley Close charging them with the payment of thirty
pounds to three of my wife's Children Sarah the wife of Job
Spendlove John Slater and George Slater each of them ten
pounds the whole of my personal Estate I Give to my wife
Elizabeth Eyre whom I nominate and appoint ^{Sole} Executrix
of this my last Will and Testament revoking all former
Wills by me at any time heretofore made I Publish and
declare this only to be my last Will and Testament in
witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & Seal the
day and year first above Written ^{his} Geo. Eyre
Signed sealed published and declared by the
Testator Geo. Eyre as and for his last Will and
Testament in the presence of us who have in his
presence and the presence of each other subscribed
our names as witnesses thereof
