in the p[ar]ish of Duffield in the County of Derby Marrier, beinge sick in body but in perfect memorie presenteth his
God for it. doo make this my Last will and Testament in manner and forme followinge. vid.

First and I have all earthly things I give and bequeath my soule into the hands of Almighty God that gav[er] it me; And in
the full and perfect assurance of the meritorious death and passion of Jesus Christ my Only Saviour and redeemer
to receive free pardon and forgiuenesse of all my sins. and as for my body to be decently buried in Christian
burial in Duffield Churche yard at the discretion of my Executrix here after nominated and appointed.
Item I give unto Mery Simos my wife All my goods Cattell and Chatells what soever bothe w[ill] in Dous and with
out burring the boarne of her naturall life,
Item I give unto my Sonne James Simos after the death of mary his mother one scold Chaire hadipping upon the p[ar]son
and two porcher dishes.
Item I give unto Mary my Daughter one greater Cattell and one Little bras pott and one Scold bed standing in the
porlor & one Closet in the over parlor,
Item I give unto Sarah Simos my Daughtter the biggest bras pott and the lesser Cattell and one bed in the Lower chamber and
two scold beds & one Chist and a Couch backe a Disheset and ten Sharpe;
Item I give unto John Simos my Sonne the Scold bed on whiche I lay when, and the Table and the frame
and the longer Coffet under the Parlor window & two porcher platters;
Item I give unto Joseph Simos my Sonne Twenty shillings if it please that he doth come home agayne

Item I doe nominate and make Mery Simos my Levinge wife whole Executrix of this my Last will and Testament
and doe remoue all other wills what were witness my hand and seal the daye and yeare above written
