In the name of god amen I Joshua Slater of Duffield in  
the county of Derby yoman being sick and weak of Body  
but of perfect mind and memory and having the free  
use of my Reason and understanding blessed be allmight<sup>ty</sup>  
god for it do make and ordaine this my last will and test-  
ament in manner and forme following first and prin-  
cipally I comend my soul into the hands allmighty god  
my heavenly father hoping for full Remission and par-  
don of all my sins through the intercession and merits of  
Jesus Christ my Lord and deare Redeemer and my Body  
I leave with my surviving Relations to be decently  
interred at the discretion of my excoutors here after  
named and as to that temporall estate it hath pleased  
god to bless mee with I dispose of in the following  
manner first it is my will that out of my heall estate  
my just debts and fundrall expences be paid and dis-  
charged Item I give and bequeth unto Ellen Slater  
my beloved wife that house I now live in with those  
fences four pieces of Land called and known by the  
name of the little walls which I bought of master will-  
iam willot of Duffield during her naturall life  
and then at her decease I bequeth the same house and  
lands before mentioned and those lands which I bought  
of master william Rainer of Duffield aforesaid known  
and called by the name of the eatons or close old hams ping  
also of master thomas Roberts then living in nottingham  
which said lands both adjoyning to those I bought of  
master william Rainer aforesaid known by the name of  
the shottow eatons with all the waye waterings hedges ditches  
commons profits and every thing there unto belonging unto my  
beloved son John Slater paying the Legacies here after named  
that is to say to my beloved son David Slater the sum of  
thirty pounds seven years after my decease also I give  
and bequeth unto my beloved son samuell Slater the sum  
of sixty pounds to be paid him when he shall arrive the age  
of three and twenty and if it should please god he should dy  
before that time I leave the same sixty pound to my son  
John Slater also I give unto my two beloved Daughters Ellen  
Slater and Elizabeth Slater the sum of sixty pounds apiece  
to be paid them when they shall attaine the age of twenty  
five years and if either or Both of them should dy before  
they shall attaine five and twenty years of age it is my will  
that the mounny be divided amongst my three youngest sons  
but if either daughter be then living it is my will she shall  
have an equall share with them also I give and bequeth  
unto my beloved wife one bed one Chest one Box and two pur-  
sies to be at her disposal by will and the Rest of the heape  
I would gods during her naturall life and then to my beloved  
son John Slater also I give and bequeth unto my beloved

Son Isaac slator the sum of tow shillings and six pence  
to be paid him att my discease when interred also I give  
unto Ellen slator my beloved wife tow cows as her own  
proper goods and all the best of my personall estate in  
manney goods, cattell and Chattells what so ever I give and  
bequeath unto my beloved son John slator and I do make  
constitute and appoint my beloved wife Ellen slator and  
my beloved son John slator to be joynt executors of this  
my last will and testament hereby revoking all former  
wills what so ever in witness whereof I have hereunto  
set my hand and seal this twenty third day of aprill  
in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and forty four  
signed sealed and delivered  
being first read in the presence  
of us who were desired to  
witness the same.
