I Thomas Slater of Shuttle in the parish of Duffield, and county of Derby, yeoman being of sound and disposing mind, memory and understanding, do make this my last Will and Testament as follows 1771.

I give devise and bequeath to my son Joseph Slater his Heirs and assigns for ever, the Dwelling house garden Croft and appurtenances thereto belonging, situate in Hazlewood in the parish aforesaid, and now in the holding of William Hitchcock; and likewise three pieces of Land situate in Hazlewood aforesaid called the meadow, lane close, and the south part of the North field, that is to say, the part thereof lying between Black-brook and the carriage road from Belper to Hollisheath, (the North part of the said North field whereon the Chapel is recently erected being included in such part of my estate as is hereinafter bequeathed to my son John Slater) which said pieces of Land are now in the occupation of the said Joseph Slater, the same charged with the payment of twenty pounds to each of my six daughters 1771; Hannah Willatt, wife of Thomas Willatt; Elizabeth Caudwell, wife of Vincent Caudwell; Ann Brown, widow of the late John Brown; Dorothy Hitchcock, wife of William Hitchcock; Mary Goodwin, wife of John Goodwin, and Sarah Robinson, wife of William Robinson, the same to be paid to the respective parties their Heirs or assigns, upon the expiration of one year from the time of my decease.

To my daughter Grace Willatt, wife of John Willatt her Heirs or assigns for ever, I give devise and bequeath, all that piece or parcel of Land, with all appurtenances thereto belonging, situate at Hazlewood aforesaid, in possession of the said John Willatt.

The residue and remainder of my Estate and Effects, of what nature or kind soever, I give devise and bequeath, to my son John Slater his Heirs or Assigns forever, the same charged with the payment of my just debts, funeral and Testamentary expenses, and likewise with the payment of twenty pounds per annum to my well beloved wife Elizabeth Slater, for the term of ~~the~~ natural life, the same to be paid in equal quarterly payments the first payment thereof, to be made upon the expiration of three calendar months, from the time of my decease; and also with the payment of one hundred and thirty five pounds each to my two daughters Hannah Gillett and Elizabeth Caldwell one hundred and fifteen pounds to each of my two daughters Ann Brown and Dorothy Hitchcock one hundred and thirty five pounds to my daughter Mary Goodwin and also of one hundred pounds to my daughter Sarah Chistone all which said sums or legacies I direct to be paid to the respective parties their Heirs or Assigns upon the expiration of one year from the time of my decease

And lastly I do hereby nominate constitute and appoint my son John Slater aforesaid and my nephew William Slater (of the Hollyhouse) Executors of this my Will and Testament In witness whereof I have hereto set my hand and seal this nineteenth day of March in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighteen
