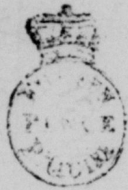

Sendeth Greeting, WHEREAS it has been alledged, before
the Rev CHARLES BUCKERIDGE, D. D. our Surrogate, that
Charles Hallam late of *Bolchill*
in the Parish of Wickswoth, in the County of *Derby*
and Diocese of *Lichfield and Coventry*, *Miner*
deceased, duly made and executed, his last Will and Testa-
ment, in writing, and therein named *George Hallam*
of Breamfield in the Parish of Wickswoth
Weaver and George Bradbury of *Bolchill* in the Parish
of *Wickswoth*, *Halter joint* Executors thereof
We therefore by these presents, Commit and Grant, to you
jointly, and severally, full power and authority to administer
the Oath under-written, to the *said George Hallam*
and George Bradbury

Executors and also to Swear the Persons
whose names are Subscribed to the Affidavit annexed to the truth thereof, and the said
Oath being administred, you are to certify the same to Us or our said Surrogate, and
subscribe your Name thereto, together with these presents, within three Months from
the date hereof. *Provided nevertheless* that this Commission shall be of no effect,
unless so certified and transmitted to US within that time. Dated at LICHFIELD, the
eighteenth day of *June* in the Year of our Lord, 1819

YOUR Oath is, that the writing, now shewed unto you, contains the original last Will, and Testament, of
Charles Hallam deceased, so far as you know and believe: that you are *the*

ing his Just Debts, and the Legacies therein bequeathed, so far as his Personal Estate will Extend, and the
Law require from you; that you will make a true, and perfect, Inventory thereof, and Exhibit the same into the
Registry of the Bishop's Consistory Court of LICHFIELD, and also a just account of your Executorship, when you
are thereunto lawfully required, and that the Goods Chattels and Credits of the said Deceased as they were at his
Death without deducting any debts owing by the said deceased therefrom, did not amount in value to the Sum of
Seven Pounds and that the Contents of the Affidavit hereto
annexed to which you have subscribed your names were and are true,

of Bolehill in the Parish of Wirksworth in the County of Derby
Minor being but weak in Body but of sound and disposing mind
memory and understanding praise be given to almighty God
for the same. Do make and ordain this my last Will and
Testament in manner and form following. First I will
and direct that all my just Debts and Funeral Expences
shall be paid by my Executors out of my real and personal
Estate. I give and devise unto my dear Mother the Rent
arising out of the allotment now in the possession of Anna
Maddock of Little Bole Hill during the Term of her natural
life and at her Decease I give and devise the said allot-
ment unto my Brother George Hallam and my Brother in Law
George Bradbury Haller equal share and share alike and
their Heirs and Assigns forever. Also I give and devise
unto my dear Mother the Rent arising from the House which
George Smith now holds of me during her natural life.
Also I give and devise at the decease of my said Mother
the said House and premises unto my Brother George
Hallam and his Heirs and Assigns forever. Also I give
and devise unto my Dear Mother one Pound Ten Shillings
per year to be paid out of the wall Close which Samuel Street
now holds of me during the term of her natural life, Also I
give and devise unto my Sister Sarah and my said Brother
in Law George Bradbury all the property jointly that my
Father gave and devised unto me in his last will and
Testament for the support of my Dear Sister Grace Hallam
and their Heirs and Assigns forever. And Lastly I do

nominat^e constitute and appoint my said Brother George
Hallam and my said Brother in Law George Bradbury joint
Executors of this my last will and Testament. hereby revoking
all former wills be me made I publish and declare that
to be my last will and Testament in witness whereof I
Charles Hallam the Testator have hereunto set my Hand
and Seal this Twenty Third Day of February in the year
of our Lord One Thousand Eight Hundred and Nineteen.
