

in manner following - I give and devise unto my only surviving son
(Joseph Hallam the younger) by my wife Hannah daughter of Isaac
Hoades the elder late of Bole hill aforesaid deceased - All that dwelling
house at Bole hill occupied by Joseph Bunting with the garden out-
buildings and appurtenances also those two closes in Bole hill
aforesaid called Hunger Hill and Kough close also that piece of
land at Bole hill aforesaid called the Nether allotment with their
and every of their appurtenances To hold to my said son Joseph
Hallam the younger his Heirs and assigns for ever Subject ¹¹ -
however to the payment thereof of the sum of Sixty pounds in Twelve
months after my death To my second and youngest daughter Hannah
wife of Joseph Wagstaff of Scorsford Tailor And in case of her death
before me or before the same becomes due, then to her children -
I also give and devise unto my eldest daughter Ellen Hallam all
the house and premises wherein I now reside with the house and
premises adjoining in possession of Peter Britland with the gardens
outbuildings and appurtenances And also all that piece of land in
Bole hill aforesaid called the Upper allotment with the appurtenances
To hold to my said daughter Ellen Hallam her Heirs and assigns
for ever - I give and bequeath all my household goods and furniture
beds bedding and the like to my said son and daughter Joseph Hallam
and Ellen Hallam share and share alike And all the rest and
residue of my personal estate and effects whatsoever and
wheresoever I give to my son Joseph Hallam, he paying

Thereout all my just debts funeral and testamentary expences
 as soon as may be after my decease And also paying thereout
 4 immediately on my death Two pounds each to my grandchildren
 Hannah, Millicent and Elizabeth Wagstaff. and to my grandchild
 Elizabeth Hallam only surviving child of my eldest son Adam Hallam
 late of Sheffield in Yorkshire Joiner deceased. And Lastly I
 appoint my said son Joseph Hallam sole Executor of this my last
 will and testament, hereby revoking any other wills by me before
 made. Publishing and declaring this only to be my last —
 In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and Seal
 this First day of January One thousand eight hundred and
 5 thirty. —
