Months from the date hereof, Provided nevertheless that this Com-
mission shall be of no Effect, unless certified and transmitted to Us
within that time; Dated at *Lichfield* the *Sixth* Day
of *May* in the Year of our Lord 1810

in the Year of our Lord One Thousand Eight Hundred and eighteen.

The Condition of this Obligation is such That if the above bounden
Mary Osbiston Administratrix of all and singular the Goods
Chattles and Credits of William Osbiston her late husband deceased do
make or cause to be made a true and perfect Inventory of all and singular the Goods
Chattles and Credits of the said deceased which have or shall come to the Hands
Possession or Knowledge of her the said Mary Osbiston
or into the Hands and Possession of any Person or Persons for
her and the same so made do exhibit or cause to be exhibited into the Registry
of the Bishops Court at Lichfield at or before the
first day of August next ensuing and the same Goods
Chattles and Credits and all other the Goods Chattles and Credits of the said deceased
at the time of his death which at any time after shall come to the hands or Possession
of the said Mary Osbiston or into the hands
and Possession of any other Person or Persons for her do well and truly administer
according to Law And further do make or cause to be made a true and just Account
of her said Administration at or before the first day of May 1789
and all the Rest and Residue of the said Goods Chattles and Credits which shall
be found remaining upon the said Administrators Account the same being first
examined and allowed of by the Judge or Judges for the time being of the said
Court shall deliver and pay unto such Person or Persons respectively as the said
Judge or Judges by his or their Decree or Sentence pursuant to the true Intent and
Meaning of a late Act of Parliament made in the two and twentieth and three and
twentieth Years of the Reign of our late Sovereign Lord King Charles the Second
intituled an Act for the better settling of Intestates Estates shall limit and appoint
And if it shall hereafter appear that any last Will and Testament was made by the
said deceased and the Executor or Executors therein named do exhibit the same into
the said Court making Request to have it allowed and approved accordingly if the
said Mary Osbiston
above bounden being thereunto required do render and deliver the said Letters of
Administration (Approbation of such Testament being first had and made) in the
said Court then this Obligation to be void or else to remain in full Force and Virtue
