of body of sound & perfect mind & memory for the which I bless  
God to make & receive this my last Will and Testament in manner &  
form following that is to say first first and principally I commend  
my Soul into the hands of Almighty God hoping in the three Jesus -  
Christ to have a full and free pardon for all my sins & justification  
to eternal life and my body to the Earth to be decently buried at the  
discretion of my Executor hereafter named and as touching such  
worldly state as it hath pleased Almighty God to bless me with in this  
life I thus bequeath & dispose of as follows

Item I do thus bequeath unto my son Thomas Spindlow one shilling

Item I thus bequeath unto my son George Spindlow one shilling

Also I do thus bequeath unto my ~~son~~ <sup>grand son</sup> Anthony Street one shilling

Also I thus bequeath unto my Daughter Mary the wife of George Haly  
sum of twenty pound

Also I thus bequeath unto my Daughter Deborah the sum of twenty pound

Also I thus bequeath unto my Daughter Lucy the sum of twenty pound  
all which said sums & legacies I order to be paid by my  
Executor at the end of one year after my decease

Item it is my will and mind that my grandson Samuel Spindlow  
be put to some trade by my Executor hereafter named

Item All the Rest of Goods chattels & whatsoever I do  
thus bequeath unto my son Job Spindlow and do make him full and  
sole Executor of this my last Will and Testament he paying  
all my just debts and legacies and I do hereby revoke and  
disannul all and every former Will and Testament by me at  
any time here to fore made as witness whereof I have  
hereunto set my hand & seal this twenty first Day of  
November one thousand seven hundred & seventy four

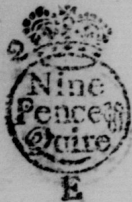
