may receive a dividend of the store
U.S. which the other part of the
line are entitled to in common
with them.

Are you comfortably settled
in your situation Military, - pray
hold your troops in readiness to
move at the shortest notice, should
you be called for.

The Enemy make many
demonstrations of an Embarkation,
- they may probably only wish to
amuse us, you'll therefore keep
the best look out.

Remembrance
